8.	Tim is unable to hear on his amplified telephone that he received from TDAP. He would like to keep using his landline to communicate with family and friends, but is afraid he will not be able to since he is unable to hear them.	
9.	Mike experiences quadriplegia and uses a power wheelchair for all of his mobility. Mike lives with his wife, and takes pride in his independence. He drives himself to and from work, and enjoys the ability to control the lights, thermostat and door locks of his home as necessary.	
10.	Jan experiences blindness and uses a braille display for electronic communication. Public transportation allows her to run family errands independently. However, when grocery shopping she can't tell the difference between the cream of mushroom and cream of chicken soup.
